The Commissioners stated that the date and time for the event would work and recommended that staff move forward with the event.

Park Steward Updates

Vukelich – Commented on the condition of the stones at Centennial Park.

MacFarlane stated that he had been in contact with different masonry vendors and was waiting to receive a few more quotes on the project.

Commissioner Vukelich added that Hawk Meadows looked good but that dog droppings were common. Inquired about the potential of adding additional dog waste signage. Railroad Park is looking good.

Bergan – MacFarlane stated that Commissioner Bergan had submitted her report electronically. MacFarlane read the email which stated that Tolzmann, Lions, and Ashton parks all looked good. Noted that there was a family at Lions Park and that they really enjoyed the balancing structure. Tolzmann also had a family enjoying the park and they appreciated the slides. Asked when parks were being mowed as the weeds were getting long.

Spangler – Blue Spruce and Fireside were both looking great. Question regarding a potential pad for the Goodview slide landing zone. Discussed City leash laws.

Jameson – All of the parks looked good.
