Mike Soule, 25782 Goldfinch Avenue, noted that he lives near Goodview Park which does not have a baseball diamond or an ice skating rink. He stated that there is an ice skating facility on the north end of town and thinks one on the south end of town would also be used. He explained that he drives a school bus and thinks that having an open skating rink that the City floods would be nice for the kids to use. He noted that he did not think it needed to be a hockey rink but just be available for open skating. He stated that he thinks this would improve the park immensely because it is located in a nice neighborhood and would provide an amenity

to the south side of town that is currently not available.

5. Emerald Ash Borer Minnesota DNR Grant

Public Works Superintendent Almhjeld gave an overview of the creation of a Tree Board, an annual budget of \$2/capita, and inventoried the City-owned trees. The goal for 2022 is to prioritize the tree projects with the completed tree inventory. He explained that the DNR has a grant available that would include the writing of an Emerald Ash program that he would like the City to apply for.

6. Park Advisory Commission Pertinent Documents

City Administrator Linwood stated that this is an informational item to ensure that all members of the PAC have its pertinent documents.

Mayor Iverson explained that they are bringing these kinds of documents to all the City's committees. She noted that attendance is very important and encouraged members to communicate with staff if they cannot attend a meeting. She noted that they should make sure that they do not "reply all" when communicating things like this because it can be considered a violation of Open Meeting laws.

City Administrator Linwood explained that beginning next month, Assistant City Administrator Alex Saxe, will be attending the PAC meetings and will be the staff liaison for this Board.

Mayor Iverson encouraged the PAC to continue to dress business-casual for the meetings. She noted that one thing she would like the PAC to consider possibly adding to the bylaws or their goals is something that is done in Chisago City. She stated that Chisago City divides and assigns the individual parks to their board members. She explained that they those board members are responsible for doing a quarterly checklist for each park they are assigned and reporting back to the PAC.

7. Open Meeting Law Review

City Administrator Linwood explained that it is important for all meetings that the City follows proper Open Meeting law practices. He explained that if there is an event, such as a park clean-up day, where the entire PAC will be present, staff tries to identify them on the calendar even if there is no business discussed.

City Administrator Linwood encouraged the PAC members to attend the event and noted that this will be the City's first ADA compliant park. He noted that the whole project turned out great and the skating rink is being heavily used.
