CALL TO ORDER:

Mayor Lisa Iverson called the Work Session Meeting of the Wyoming City Council for December 13, 2022 to order at 5:30 P.M.

Mayor Iverson determined a Quorum was present.

NEW BUSINESS:

1. Presentation from Wold Architects on the Public Safety Building Finishes

Jonathan Loose, Wold Architects- Explained the physical materials shown tonight are examples of what finishes will be used, but during the bid process they could change slightly.

Paige Sullivan, Wold Architects- Gave a brief presentation on the construction timeline, current layout and design of the exterior and interior of the building.

Mayor Iverson- Stated she has a concern about the carpeting. She said in the gathered areas, it could be hard to clean and wanted to know if it will be easy to clean and asked if there are other options.

Jonathan Loose- Stated that it is walk off carpet which is very durable and dirt and mud comes out easily.

Councilmember Schilling- Asked if they are carpet tiles or rolls.

Paige Sullivan- Stated they are carpet tiles.

Mayor Iverson- Expressed concerns about cost of some of the materials in the kitchen area.

Paige Sullivan- Explained the materials chosen were for durability while also taking cost into consideration.

Councilmember Nanko Yeager- Asked if the oven and refrigerator were commercial grade and asked if food could be prepared on the counter tops and center island.

Paige Sullivan- Stated they are residential grade, the renderings made them look wider. She stated food could be prepared on those surfaces because they are not plastic material.

Councilmember Luger- Asked if the center island could be taken out and add more tables to fit more staff and help with cost reduction.

Jonathan Loose- Stated the configuration in the kitchen is designed to help public safety staff congregate and collaborate more easily.

Councilmember Schilling- Stated the materials need to be durable to last and the counter tops and island encourage people to bring and prepare food versus eating out.

The Council took some time to look and feel the materials that were brought. Council did not have any other questions or concerns. Wold Architects will continue with the final design.
